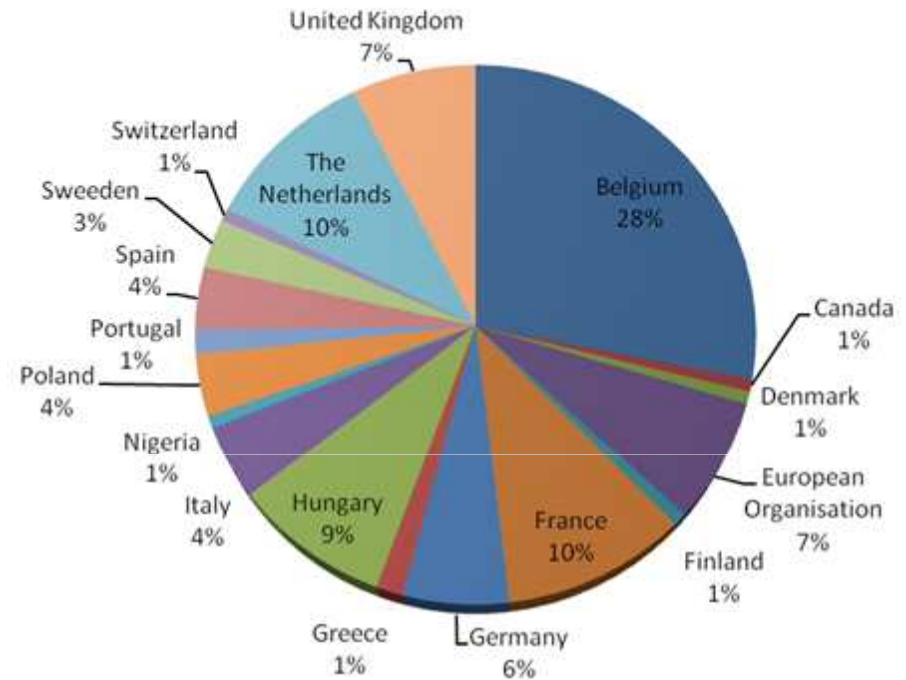
## ▷ Scope of BioreFuture 2009
